Are you putting out a "Welcome Burglar" sign?



Unfortunately, the burglar doesn't need to look very long to discover "Welcome Burglar" signs unwittingly left around many homes. Look at your home through a burglar's eyes. Does it look like an easy target? Are there obvious security weaknesses? There are easy, effective and inexpensive crime prevention measures that residents should employ.

Burglary is a crime of opportunity

Don't give the burglar a helping hand. Most home burglars are amateurs seeking easy targets. Homes which present the least risk of detection allow the greatest opportunity for easy access and the maximum potential for successful escape. Those are homes which appear unoccupied and unprotected; homes without adequate locks and lighting; and locations that offer concealment from neighbors and passing motorists.

Make the burglars work risky and difficult, and you stand a good chance of stopping them before they get in. To a burglar visibility means vulnerability. They hide behind fences and shrubbery. The key is to keep trespassers out while keeping your property visible. Burglars try the doors and windows first. If burglars have difficulty here, chances are they will move on to another property.

Tips on Making Your Home More Secure

Give your home the appearance of occupancy at all times.

At night, leave outdoor lights on. Effective lighting over doorways and garages, and strategically placed floodlights, particularly those with motion detectors, add to prevention measures.

Make a habit of keeping garage doors closed and locked. Open garage doors attract burglars.

Clean up your neighborhood. Run down properties tell criminals that you don't care about where you live or your neighbors.

When you go away from home for a period of time, arrange for mail and newspaper deliveries to be stopped or have a neighbor pick them up.

Ask a neighbor to tend your vard and watch your home when you are away.

Leave spare keys with a trusted neighbor, not under a doormat or planter, on a ledge, or in a mailbox.

Ensure that sliding glass doors have strong working key locks and a dowel or a pin to secure the sliding glass doors to prevent them from being shoved aside or lifted off the track.

Make certain that your house number is clearly displayed so police and other emergency vehicles can find the house quickly.

Before going to bed, check that all doors & windows are locked and then look outside for anything that looks suspicious. Look at your vehicles, your neighbors' vehicles, your property and any neighbors' properties that are visible. Check for anything that looks out of place.

And most importantly, know your neighbors and know what looks right in your neighborhood.

Hello Neighbors - Your Maintenance Team here: Joe, Bill and Wayne

As winter approaches, we thought it would be good to talk about preparing our homes for the colder weather. We will save the usual info about inspecting the caulking around your windows and doors, and closing the foundation vents for another issue. We thought a bigger issue for us is to talk with you about is the issue of mice and rats, which will start looking for a winter home soon.

Ever since the construction started at Ridgley Manor, those of us in the Haygood Point section have seen a dramatic increase in the number of rats in our neighborhood. If we have them, most likely they are in your section as well Wayne had a rather costly experience with these pests. In the spring just after construction began in Ridgley Manor, Wayne started up his lawn sprinkler system, only to discover two of his zones were not working. Further investigation revealed that rats had taken up residence in his crawl space and had eaten through his sprinkler lines looking for water. He had lived in his home for ten years with no problems up to that point. Well the short of the story is — there were three holes in his foundation which were not visible from the outside. He called a pest control service to assist with the problem. They inspected the crawl space and found the holes in the foundation. They also installed two bait boxes around the perimeter of his home, at a initial cost of \$135.00.

The bait boxes seem to be working, but they need to be re-baited every couple of weeks. Wayne is re-baiting the boxes himself now. The bait boxes were expensive; however, his major expense was in repairing the lines to his sprinkler system, and installing new duct work and insulation under his home.

Please take the time to inspect or have someone inspect your foundation for possible entry points for these pests. If you have vinyl siding, be sure to check for looseness at the intersection of the siding and the brick skirt. If you find evidence of mice or rats in your crawl space, please have someone close up the holes the pests are using to get through and set your traps or bait boxes.

If you find you have a problem, you can minimize your expense of dealing with these destructive pests by doing it yourself, with the online purchase of the necessary materials. The bait boxes Wayne and Bill use can be purchased from the following web site: http://www.pestcontrolsupplies.com/RatControlProducts.htm?gclid=CLqNivL6kZ0CFSBN5Qodn3lx1w

Bulky item collection service for normal household discards is provided, free of charge, for residents who receive City waste collection service. Most household discards will be collected. However, the following are not collected: remodeling and building materials, carpet, doors, cabinets, sinks, rocks, dirt, concrete, vehicle parts, glass or hazardous materials.

In order to process your request, a list of discarded items must be provided. Please mention if you have a freon-containing appliance, as these items require special handling. Be sure to include your email address and phone number in case we need to contact you. Items should be placed at the curb by 7am on your regular collection day.

Residents should request bulky item pickup service no later than 5 p.m. the workday before the regular trash collection day.

Neighbors: Please do not place your bulky items for pickup until the evening prior to pickup.
