Neighborhood Watch Sam Hribal

Neighborhood Watch did not take a vacation this summer. Block Cap-

tains, Area Coordinators and our neighbors kept a close watch on our community. Yes, we did have some incidents and these were quickly relayed to the VBPD, were investigated and at least one resulted in an arrest. Neighbors watching out for each other helps keep undesirables out of our community.

We are actively working toward certifying the last remaining area, Lake Smith Terrace South. We need two Block Captains in the blocks just east of the "Duck Crossing" on Five Forks and Ewell Roads. If you or someone that you know could take this on, please contact me (232-3018) or Mary O'Neill (464-6324).

Beware of unscrupulous solicitors. Door-todoor solicitors are required by Virginia Beach City Code to have a copy of the City issued solicitor's permit with them at the time they are soliciting. The permit should contain a recent photograph of the solicitor presenting it. If they cannot produce it, call the VBPD (385-5000).

Watch for the unusual – if you suspect anything out of the ordinary, see suspicious people or see suspicious activity in the neighborhood:

• <u>First</u> call VBPD non-emergency number, 385-5000. Give them a description of the person or persons and describe why you feel they are acting suspicious.

• <u>Second</u> call your Neighborhood Watch Block Captain.

If you see an actual crime being committed or about to be committed, call VBPD at <u>911 immediately.</u>

Report crime and suspicious activities to police; agree to testify when necessary. Stand up for what you believe in if you want a safe community.

Your neighbor is watching out for you --- make sure that you are reciprocating.





We are here to help you interact with the city and the neighborhood to help keep our community looking the way you want it to and to insure any safety features are addressed. If you have concerns about maintenance or safety issues, please let us know. Wayne will be the primary point of contact, and his phone number is **671-7991**.

We wanted to use this issue of the Ripples to address a potential safety issue that may exist in our community. For those of us who own corner lots, our shrubs, ornamental trees or other tall vegetation at the intersections of our roads may present a hazard to people driving through the neighborhood. If you have shrubs, hedges or other tall vegetation on the corner of your lot, they may prevent drivers from seeing other on-coming traffic at the intersection of your corner. If you do own a corner lot, would you please check to see if you have any vegetation which could inhibit a driver's ability to see traffic approaching from another direction? If you find there is a potential problem, please prune the vegetation to eliminate the issue. Thank you for your assistance with this important issue.



Did You Know That... Patrick Dunstan

- 1. Last year nearly 2.5 million burglaries took place in the U.S.(That's one every 12 seconds)
- 2. Homes without alarm systems are 15 times more likely to be targeted by burglars.
- 3. Losses attributed to burglaries average \$1,675 per event.
- 4. On average, only 13% will be solved by authorities.
- 5. Nearly 40% of all burglaries take place during the day.
- 6. 81% of entries occur through first floor entry points; 34% through the front door.
- 7. Burglars prefer breaking into unoccupied homes and normally proceed directly to the bedroom area to look for cash, jewelry, weapons and drugs.
- 8. Police believe that alarms deter 90% of burglary attempts.
- 9. Burglars avoid homes equipped with alarms because of the "threat of apprehension".
- 10. The existence of a yard sign from a reputable security company deters a burglar from targeting that property.



What is the Citizens' Advisory Committee?

It is a program established by the Virginia Beach Police Department to enhance its ability to communicate with the community. The program is made up of advisory groups, known as a Precinct Citizens' Advisory Committees. Each police precinct formed a C.A.C. to work with the Precinct Commander on issues they face in their community. Our Third Precinct committee meets on the third Thursday of each month at Bayside High School cafeteria. The purpose of the committee is to:

- •Provide a forum for obtaining input about the delivery of police service
- •Provide a formalized process that would facilitate citizen and community cooperation with the police.
- •Identify specific and potential areas concerning police services

The C.A.C. also helps raise money for purchasing much needed police equipment that is specific to the individual precinct and helps with the officers' duties.

All citizens are invited and encouraged to attend and participate in these meetings. It gives the citizens a chance to address neighborhood concerns with police officials in an informal setting. Each month a speaker is invited from a City or State Agency to familiarize citizens with how various programs and department functions work, and to better serve the citizens of the city.


